Program Description

The Master in Physical Therapy program is a professional graduate degree program for physical therapists who aspire to elevate their competencies as movement experts and leaders in a specialized area of practice. The program highlights the development of advanced competencies enabling graduates to promote movement as key to improved health. The program emphasizes the cultivation of competencies necessary to lead in effecting change in clinical practice and the physical therapy profession. Students will have clinical opportunities to engage in reasoning and investigate issues affecting client care within the context of an ethical and reflective practice. Students will develop critical analysis and judicious integration of theories, physiology, and best available evidence in addressing complex client problems.

Program Objectives

Upon completing the MPT program, the graduate will:

1. Manage complex client needs in a specialized area of physical therapy practice through evidence-informed clinical skills and seamless integration of decision-making concepts.
2. Manage physical therapy problems or issues with real-world clinical practice implications through scientific inquiry.
3. Lead in addressing complex problems within a specialized area of physical therapy practice.
4. Uphold ethical and professional behaviors expected of a proficient and socially responsible physical therapist.

The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

1. General weighted average of 2.00 or better;
 2. Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
 3. No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.
- **A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.

Mode of Teaching: Hybrid

Schedule of Classes: Weekdays and Saturday

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

The following are the minimum program requirements:

The following are the minimum program requirements:

1. Good scholastic record from any recognized institution of higher learning
2. Holder of a degree in Bachelor of Science in Physical Therapy.
3. Local applicants who will practice physical therapy in the Philippines must have a license to practice the profession in the country.
4. Foreign applicants who will practice physical therapy in the Philippines while enrolled in the program must abide by the rules set by the Professional Regulation Commission for physical therapy practice in the Philippines.
5. Must have at least 6 months of documented professional experience in clinical practice.
6. Expressed professional needs and career goals of the applicant must match the program.
7. Must pass an interview.
8. Must show proof of at least a satisfactory (based on the school's grading scale) rating in assessment and treatment techniques during undergraduate courses.
9. Certification that one's work supports the applicant's intent to study.
10. For clinicians, a recent sample of treatment plan and evaluation of a client (de-identified)
11. Essay (800 to 1000 words; Limit to 1-page, no smaller than 10.5 font, single space) on the following questions:
 - a. How do you think MPT will influence your career?
 - b. Upon graduating from MPT, what knowledge and skill-set do you expect to have?
 - c. What is your motivation for pursuing graduate study?
 - d. What is your view of self-directed learning as a method of instruction?
