MASTER IN REHABILITATION SCIENCE



Program Description

The Master in Rehabilitation Science (MRS) is a professional degree of advance studies in the specialized yet multidisciplinary field of rehabilitation sciences. The MRS will develop the rehabilitation professional's role in actualizing the societal integration (i.e. societal participation) of persons with (PWD) and those at-risk for disability (ARD). The program integrates ethical practice, critical and independent thinking, and collaborative practice.

Program Objectives

The MRS aims to develop graduates who possess advanced competencies that will enable them to promote quality of life and societal integration (i.e. participation) of persons with disabilities or those at risk of disabilities in their role/s as health providers, managers and leaders of programs and projects, advocates for PWD and ARD, and evidence-based practitioners.

The following are the program outcomes for the various roles the MRS graduate will fulfill:

1. Develop plans and programs that focus on societal integration (i.e. participation) and advancement of the rights of PWD and those ARD.
2. Manage rehabilitation projects/programs that focus on societal integration (i.e. participation) and advancement of the rights of persons with disability and those at risk.
3. Utilize culturally appropriate information and communication systems in the various roles of rehabilitation professional to advocate for the rights of persons with and at-risk for disabilities.
4. Communicate effectively, in oral and written forms, evidence-informed program plans or outcomes that focus on societal participation and advancement of the rights of persons with disability and those at risk, in professional venues (e.g. publication in scientific journals, scientific meetings, symposiums, conferences, etc.)

The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

1. General weighted average of 2.00 or better;
2. Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
3. No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.

**A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.

Mode of Teaching: Hybrid

Schedule of Classes: Weekdays and Saturday

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

The following are the minimum program requirements:

1. Must be a graduate of a rehabilitation science program (e.g., BS Occupational, BS Therapy, BS Physical Therapy, BS Speech Pathology)
2. Must present a proof of qualification in their own profession (i.e., their own professional license and/or certification from professional associations from their country/jurisdiction)
3. Preferably have had at least one year of work experience.
4. Have the capability for self-directed learning.
5. Have scholastic ability and potential for postgraduate study.
6. Successfully undergo an entrance interview.
7. Duly accomplished Application Form NGOHS (downloadable through the website: ngohs.upm.edu.ph)
8. Comply with the General requirements the found on the 2nd page of Application Form (UPM-NGS-OP-01F1)

Graduation Requirements:

- Residency of 1 academic year immediately prior to awarding of a degree.
- Completion of 30 units (13 units of core courses, 11 units of major, and 6 units of thesis.
- Satisfactory completion of a capstone project and satisfactory performance in a comprehensive examination.
