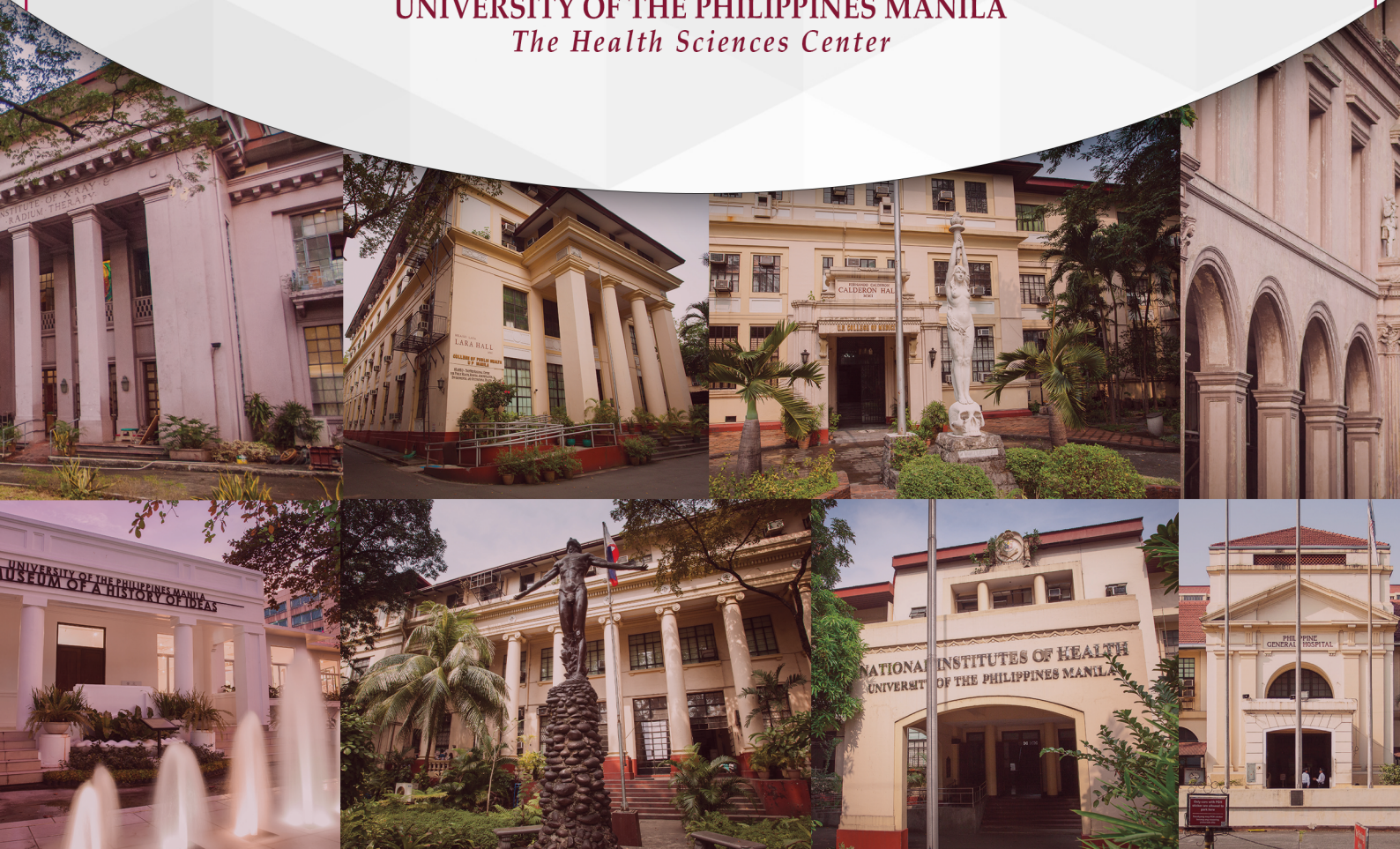

UP MANILA AT A GLANCE

The University of the Philippines Manila (UP Manila) is one of the eight constituent universities of the University of the Philippines (UP) System. It is a public and secular institution of higher learning that offers academic and training programs, as well as extension services in the health sciences, health professions education, arts, and sciences.

Established in 1908 as the birthplace of the UP System, it has played a crucial role in health education and medical advancements. It is composed of nine (9) degree-granting units and two non-degree-granting units. The degree granting units continuously providing the highest quality of advance instruction, basic and applied research and community service are the College of Allied Medical Professions (CAMP), College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), College of Dentistry (CD), College of Medicine (CM), College of Nursing (CN), College of Pharmacy (CP), College of Public Health (CPH), National Teacher Training Center for the Health Professions (NTTCHP), and the School of Health Sciences (SHS). Its non-degree-granting units are the Philippine General Hospital (PGH), the biggest modern government tertiary hospital in the Philippines servicing more than 600,000 patients annually and the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the country's leading health research and development institution.

DECEMBER 1905

The College of Medicine was created as the Philippine Medical School (PMS) through Philippine Commission Act No. 1415. It was later renamed to reflect its expanded academic scope.

FEBRUARY 1914

The College of Pharmacy (CP) was established as a program under the College of Medicine before becoming an independent academic unit.

JUNE 1927

The College of Public Health (CPH) traces its roots to the School of Sanitation and Public Health, which laid the foundation for public health education in the country.

JUNE 1951

The College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) began as a night school for working students and later expanded to offer general education and degree programs.



SEPTEMBER 1910

The Philippine General Hospital (PGH) was opened to provide healthcare services to the public and serve as a training ground for medical students.

FEBRUARY 1915

The College of Dentistry (CD) was founded as a department under the College of Medicine and later became a separate college.

APRIL 1948

The College of Nursing (CN) was established in the university, shifting from a hospital apprenticeship model to a baccalaureate program, standardizing nursing education in the country.

JANUARY 1975

- The National Teacher Training Center for the Health Professions (NTTCHP) was created to enhance the instructional competencies of educators in the health sciences.



FEBRUARY 1998

- The National Institutes of Health (NIH) was created to coordinate existing research units and serve as the country's lead agency in health research and development.



JUNE 2010

- The School of Health Sciences (SHS) in Koronadal was opened to further expand health workforce development in Mindanao.



NOVEMBER 1962

- The College of Allied Medical Professions (CAMP) was established as a department under the College of Medicine. It became the first school in the Philippines and in Asia for occupational therapy, physical therapy and speech pathology.



APRIL 1976

- The School of Health Sciences (SHS) in Palo, Leyte was established to train community-based health workers for underserved areas.



JULY 2008

- The School of Health Sciences (SHS) in Baler, Aurora was opened to extend the SHS model of community-oriented health education.



FEBRUARY 2021

- The School of Health Sciences (SHS) in Tarlac City was opened as the newest SHS campus to strengthen the delivery of health education in Central Luzon.

UP Manila received the highest honors from the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOP/HIL) Innovation Technology Support Offices (ITSO) 2.0 Program, achieving Platinum Hall of Fame status and securing a patent abroad.

COLLEGE OF MEDICINE

The College of Medicine, founded in 1905, was the first college established under the University of the Philippines, predating the official establishment of the UP System in June 1908. The College has continued to innovate its programs and offerings throughout the years, including the seven-year INTEGRATED Liberal Arts and MEDICINE (INTARMED), the dual degree Doctor of Medicine and Doctor of Philosophy in Molecular Medicine (MD-PhD), the Doctor of Medicine and Master of Public Health (MD-MPH), and the College's official journal, *Acta Medica Philippina*.

Testament to over a century of unwavering commitment to advancing medical education, research, and service, the College has been conferred the distinction of being a Center of Excellence in Medicine by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and has been consistently recognized as a top performing school in the Physician Licensure Examinations. The UPCM promotes various career pathways in the fields of Public Health or Community Medicine, Primary Care, Research, Academe, Clinical Residency, and Postgraduate Studies. Common to each pathway is the UPCM's goal to produce doctors both excellent and highly attuned to the health needs of the Filipino.

COLLEGE OF PHARMACY

Since its beginning in 1911, the College of Pharmacy has been extensively involved in teaching, research, and public service in the various fields of pharmacy and the pharmaceutical sciences. After more than a century of history, the College had contributed to research in the extraction, isolation, and characterization of Philippine medicinal plants where it played a major role in the technology transfer and eventual commercialization of herbal medicines from Lagundi (*Vitex negundo*) and Sambong (*Blumea balsamifera*) through the National Integrated Research Program on Medicinal Plants. The College continually leads and innovates in pharmacy education through the offering of pioneer programs in the country for the degrees in BS Pharmaceutical Sciences, and the MS in Social and Administrative Pharmacy.

The College has received the Level IV accreditation from the Philippine Accrediting Association of Schools, Colleges and Universities (PAASCU) for the undergraduate BS Pharmacy and BS Pharmaceutical Sciences programs. The College is also home to the University of the Philippines Drugs of Abuse Research Laboratory (UP DARL), a research and public service facility which continuously aids clinicians and healthcare professionals in toxicology cases and supports several government agencies in their programs on managing drug use and abuse in the country.

The College has proudly produced two national scientists, respected leaders in local and international pharmacists' organizations, and thousands of alumni who have contributed to the growth and development of the practice of the profession in the industry, in the community, in government regulatory agencies, in non-government organizations, and in the field of research and the academe. The College has several partner universities and memberships abroad, such

as the ASEAN-Pharmacy Education Network, US-ASEAN Pharmacy Consortium, International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP), and FIP-UNESCO UNITWIN Centre for Excellence in Western Pacific Region.

The College offers academic programs that span the wide fields of the pharmacy profession from the sciences to practice. The degree programs in pharmaceutical sciences is designed to producing highly skilled and capable graduates who are equipped to excel in the dynamic and rapidly evolving fields of regulatory science, drug discovery and development, and product design and development. The degrees in pharmacy and social and administrative pharmacy prepares graduates who are competent in the clinical practice areas, patient care, and for careers in governmental agencies, pharmaceutical firms, community pharmacies, universities, professional bodies, and health insurance companies, all of which have a direct and indirect impact on optimizing healthcare outcomes.

COLLEGE OF DENTISTRY

The College of Dentistry (CD) of UP Manila is the country's premier academic institution and envisions itself to be a pioneer in improving and modernizing dental education, research and service.

CD is the first dental academic institution in the country to acquire a Simodont virtual haptic simulator, a research laboratory with state-of-the-art equipment and a Center for Oral Health for advanced studies and treatment of complex dental cases as its service arm. The COH also houses a dental digital laboratory, making CD the first dental academic institution to integrate digital dentistry in its undergraduate courses and continuing education activities.

CD is the first dental school to establish a Department of Community Dentistry, a testament to the College's commitment to improve the oral health of the Filipinos. CD is also the first dental school to establish a graduate program in Orthodontics and the only accredited orthodontic graduate program by the Philippine Board of Orthodontics.

Graduates of the Doctor of Dental Medicine program can have the following career pathways:

1. As a general dental practitioner in private practice, hospitals, local government units (as public health dentists), private companies, law enforcement agencies
2. Academician in colleges and universities
3. Researcher and innovator
4. Dental materials and pharmaceuticals and allied industry consultants

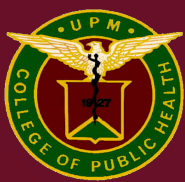

COLLEGE OF PUBLIC HEALTH

The UP College of Public Health (CPH) was established for the training of medical officers in the Philippine Health Service (now, Department of Health). The UP CPH is at the forefront of research studies on environmental health, emergency and disaster risk reduction and management, health promotion and education, nutrition, immunology and vaccination, communicable diseases, and noncommunicable diseases. It is heavily involved in numerous health service researches, including primary health care, universal healthcare coverage, human health resources, healthcare funding, hospital administration, dental public health, and occupational health and safety.

The College hosts two extension programs: the Dr. Stephen Zuellig Program for Health Leadership and Governance (DSZPHLG), and the Program for Health Equity (PHE). The DSZPHLG champions healthier, more resilient communities by shaping transformative health leaders, while the PHE aims to conduct, facilitate, and encourage translational research in order to achieve health equity for all Filipinos. The college is the designated Regional Centre for Public Health, Hospital Administration, and Environmental and Occupational Health of the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) Tropical Medicine and Public Health Network (TROPMED), and serves as the Asian Health Literacy Association (AHLA)'s designated country office in the Philippines.

UP CPH is a member of the following international and national consortia, alliance, and associations: International Academic Consortium for Sustainable Cities (IACSC); Asia-Pacific Academic Consortium for Public Health (APACPH); Alliance for Healthy Cities (AFHC); ASEAN Association of Schools of Medical Technology (AASMT); Philippine Association of Schools of Medical Technology and Public Health, Inc. (PASMETH); and Philippine Academic Consortium on Public Health (PACPH).

Graduates of the UP CPH are equipped with multidisciplinary knowledge and skills that prepare them for diverse and

impactful career pathways in the country and abroad. They may pursue roles in government agencies such as the DOH, local government units, and international organizations where they contribute to research generation, policy development, program management, and health systems strengthening. Many serve as public health practitioners, researchers, and educators in academic and research institutions, advancing evidence-based practice and training the next generation of public health professionals. Others may work in hospitals, nongovernmental organizations, and the private sector, focusing on disease prevention, environmental and occupational health, health promotion, and community development. With its strong foundation in leadership, service, and global health perspectives, UP CPH opens opportunities for graduates to become leaders, innovators, and advocates who shape health policies and interventions toward better population health outcomes.

The University of the Philippines College of Nursing (UPCN) has stood as a premier institution for nursing education in the Philippines since 1948. It has built on a rich legacy that began in 1907, when nursing instruction was offered at the Philippine Training School for Nurses, and then at the Philippine General Hospital School of Nursing in 1915. Since then, UP Nursing has evolved in step with the nation's changing health needs and global developments in the profession. UPCN has been designated by the World Health Organization as a Collaborating Center (WHOCC) for Nursing Development in Primary Health Care from 1989-1997 and as a WHOCC for Leadership in Nursing Development from 2004. It has upheld a legacy of excellence rooted in academic excellence, public service, and social responsibility.

UPCN plays a vital role in shaping competent, compassionate, and committed nurses who respond to the nation's health needs. Guided by its mandate to serve as a center of excellence in nursing, UPCN blends rigorous academic training with community-oriented practice. Its programs integrate liberal education with professional preparation, fostering critical thinking, ethical leadership, and cultural sensitivity. The College has led the way in adopting teaching-learning innovations such as the competency-based curriculum, simulation-based education, digital technologies in education, and interprofessional education. UPCN prepares students to become primary care providers in hospitals and communities, clinical nurse specialists with advanced expertise, nurse educators and managers shaping future health professionals, and researchers committed to evidence-based practice. The College is committed to developing future leaders in nursing, offering a full spectrum of degree programs including BS Nursing, MS Nursing (with academic and advanced clinical practice tracks), Master in Nursing Education, and PhD in Nursing. Its graduates are prepared to make a significant impact on healthcare as primary care providers, advanced nurse practitioners, nurse educators, nurse managers, policymakers, and researchers.

NATIONAL TEACHER TRAINING CENTER FOR THE HEALTH PROFESSIONS

Founded in 1975, the National Teacher Training Center for the Health Professions (NTTCHP) remains, five decades later, one of only two surviving national teacher training centers originally established within the World Health Organization (WHO) global network. In 2012, it was designated by the WHO Western Pacific Region (WPRO) as a Regional Education Development Center.

Since its inception, NTTCHP has conducted extensive teacher training activities, seminars, and workshops for diverse groups of health professionals across various settings. To broaden its reach nationwide, the Center regularly offers virtual seminars lasting two to three hours, held every other month since the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, annual Inter-University Workshops (IUWs) provide two- to three-day intensive training programs on health professions education (HPEd) for faculty members of partner institutions. The most recent IUW, co-organized with Palawan State University – School of Medicine, took place at the Aziza Hotel in Puerto Princesa, Palawan.

NTTCHP's training activities are widely regarded as valuable by health professions institutions, professional societies, and organizations. Faculty members are frequently invited to serve as speakers, facilitators, and resource persons at conferences and conventions on HPEd topics. These engagements form part of the Center's community and extension service contributions. In 2010, NTTCHP published *Teaching and Learning in the Health Sciences*, the first textbook on health professions education authored in the Philippines. The book received the Most Outstanding Book Award from the National Academy of Science and Technology. Currently undergoing revision, the second edition will integrate emerging and advanced topics in HPEd and health sciences pedagogy.

Over the past five years, NTTCHP has strengthened its local and international linkages. Its global partners include Tokyo

Metropolitan University (Japan), Inje University (South Korea), and, most recently, the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI) – University College Dublin (UCD) Malaysia Campus (RUMC) Penang, Malaysia. Locally, it has established formal collaborations with West Visayas State University (Janiuay Campus), Palawan State University (PSU), Samar State University (SSU), and Our Lady of Fatima University (OLFU).

Graduates of the Master in Health Professions Education (MHPED) and Master of Arts in Health Professions Education (MAHPED) programs are equipped to serve as educators and training officers; program, curriculum, and instructional designers and evaluators; as well as researchers contributing to the advancement of health professions education. Meanwhile, graduates of the Doctor of Health Professions Education (DrHPEd) program, in addition to teaching and facilitating learning in health sciences institutions, are prepared to assume leadership, managerial, and supervisory positions. They may serve in key capacities such as Presidents or Chancellors, Vice Chancellors, Deans, Directors, and other executive roles in health sciences institutions.

The School of Health Sciences (SHS) of UP Manila is a globally recognized leader in transformative, community-based health professions education. Through its pioneering stepladder curriculum, the first of its kind in Asia, SHS develops socially accountable midwives, nurses, and physicians who return to serve underserved, geographically isolated, and disadvantaged communities. With nearly five decades of experience in health equity and rural workforce development, SHS has become a model for socially accountable education globally. Anchored on its commitment to primary health care, SHS continues to reshape health systems toward achieving universal health coverage and the Sustainable Development Goals.

UPM-SHS is internationally cited as a model for socially accountable, community-engaged medical education. Its impact has been recognized by the Philippine Civil Service Commission through the Lingkod Bayan Award, and its approach is cited by the World Health Organization and global networks like THEnet (Training for Health Equity Network). SHS graduates are proven to have stronger rural retention, community service commitment, and leadership roles in local health systems—contributing directly to national and global priorities on rural health equity and health workforce distribution.

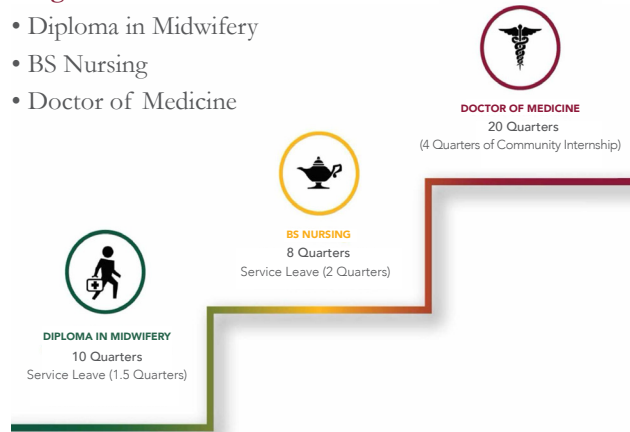

The soon-to-rise 18 level NIH Building is designed to be an iconic edifice in the UP Manila campus. Once finished, this will be the first high-rise laboratory facility in the country. It will also be the tallest all-steel building structure using the special concentrically braced framing system. This is one of the biggest endeavors of the UP System since 1908. The new NIH building has a total floor area of 34,645 square meters. The building will serve as a clinical research infrastructure that utilizes ultramodern, resilient, and sustainable design.

The Philippine General Hospital is considered the biggest modern government tertiary hospital in the Philippines, servicing approximately 700,000 patients annually. It is the only national referral center for tertiary care, providing direct and quality patient services to thousands of indigent Filipinos all over the country.

As the teaching hospital of UP Manila and the heart of the university's health sciences campus, PGH has 20 clinical departments. It is where postgraduate and undergraduate students undergo rigorous clinical rotations in various departments under the tutelage of leaders of medicine, nursing, and allied health professions. Didactics, ward rounds and preceptorships, emergency room duties, outpatient clinics, operating theater rotations, and departmental and interdepartmental conferences are included in the clinical rotations.

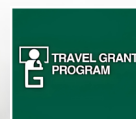

PUBLIC SERVICE

Ugnayan ng Pahinungod Manila

Established in 1994 as the UP Manila chapter of the system-wide volunteer service organization, Ugnayan ng Pahinungod/Oblation Corps, the Office of Ugnayan ng Pahinungod-Manila provides international support to volunteer activities where UP Manila constituents get to share more of their skills and talents with less privileged Filipinos.

Its current programs are clustered into three: Educational Program (Teachers Development Program, Tutorial Services Program); Community Health Programs (Gurong Pahinungod, Affirmative Action Program, Health Missions, Health Education and Training, Emergency Room Volunteers Program, Hospice Care Program-SHPM); and Social Services Programs (Summer Immersion Service Program, Program for the Streetchildren, Livelihood Program, Disaster Preparedness and Risk Reduction Management Program, Environmental Health Education Program). There is one stand-alone program: the Advocacy Program. Its volunteers come from the ranks of the health professionals, personnel, students, alumni, and other willing volunteers from sectors outside the University.

The Ugnayan ng Pahinungod-Manila has served more than 137,000 Filipinos.



Community Health and Development Program (CHDP)

The UP CHDP is the UP Manila unit mandated by the University to enter into partnerships with Philippine municipalities to set up and maintain community-based health programs (CBHPs) that will benefit both parties. It provides the site for the community immersion and the curricular public service work of UP faculty, staff and students. The current partners are the Province of Cavite and the four municipalities of the MAGNAMARTE Inter-Local Health Zone.

In 2007, the CHDP was revived by then-Chancellor Ramon Arcadio. Its conceptual framework considers the community as a partner in health and development towards a healthier and more empowered community. As of 2025, the CHDP membership is composed of 14 academic units from UP Manila and UP Diliman.

The objectives of the CHDP are to assist communities in attaining enhanced capacities in their own health care and development through the Primary Health Care Approach while providing learning opportunities for the faculty and students of UP in the principles and practice of community health and development, which they can also use in their extension and volunteer work.
